Tampa, November 17, 2011: Attorney Robert Tucker II is passionate about the Movember mustache charity event. This annual event is all about raising funds and awareness in support of men's health. "Both my father and uncle have suffered from Prostate Cancer, the #2 cancer killer of men*. I want to help raise awareness so men will feel more comfortable about seeking early detection – the best way to survive this terrible disease."

Attorney Tucker not only signed up for Movember, but also enlisted many of the male attorneys and staff at Feldman, Fox & Morgado. Now in the third week of Mo growth, many are still *growing* strong. "Some of our spouses have had to endure the growth and are providing support others *shave it off* pressure," says Tucker. "But, it is with the support and pressure of our women, that men are best convinced to take early detection seriously. Our team is Scales of Mustache and *We Fight for the Mustache*, a play on words of our Firm tagline," Tucker concludes.

Recent Movember research revealed:

- 96% of participants spent time thinking about improving their general health
- 86% of participants had a general check-up during the year
- 77% discussed men's health with their family, friends or colleagues during Movember
- 59% carried out personal research on men's health issues during Movember
- 64% worried about their general health
- 87% understood that their health depends on how well they take care of themselves

The fundraising effort for Movember is increasing year-over-year and so is the awareness of the cause. In the Island Center, where Feldman, Fox & Morgado have their Tampa offices, they have even enlisted the café. By allowing us to put our information in the café window, both the café manager and building management are helping to support our efforts and this cause.

What are the key statistics about prostate cancer?

Other than skin cancer, prostate cancer is the most common cancer in American men. The latest American Cancer Society estimates for prostate cancer in the United States are for 2011:

- About 240,890 new cases of prostate cancer will be diagnosed
- About 33,720 men will die of prostate cancer

About 1 man in 6 will be diagnosed with prostate cancer during his lifetime. More than 2 million men in the United States who have been diagnosed with prostate cancer at some point are still alive today.

Prostate cancer is the second leading cause of cancer death in American men, behind only lung cancer. About 1 man in 36 will die of prostate cancer.
